Nasher Sculpture Center Virtual Field Trip

Title: 2D / 3D Grade Level: Elementary

Discover how an artist can express an idea in a flat artwork, like a painting or drawing, and in a three-dimensional sculpture. Students will learn how to create 3D artworks using 2D materials.

Outcomes

Students will:

- 1) Learn the difference between two-dimensional and three-dimensional works of art.
- 2) Discover how artists' 2D works on paper can inform 3D sculptures.
- 3) Find cultural and personal connections to artworks.
- 4) Engage in critical thinking and creative expression.
